VERITAS, CARITAS, ET RISUS

Have you ever read ahead in a book? To see if the hero survives or how some other built-up narrative tension is resolved? Maybe it is just me, but I will occasionally look at the last paragraph in a book, which might be high heresy to some. But there it is.

This is also true of my understanding of the season of Advent. I know I am supposed to wait. Wait to break out the Christmas carols. Wait to focus on Christmassy themes. Wait patiently for spiritual tension to build before December 25. And yet I will sometimes stray from that script.

Over the course of our lives, our relationship with the Christmas season changes. For children, there is anticipation of the big day, but not the somber, Advent-style of waiting. Even when I attended parochial school long ago, the season was more about celebration than religious expectancy. As adults, Christmas becomes more about planning and logistics, the battle plan for the holidays. This is not just about eating your vegetables but peeling and cooking them...as well as convincing yourself that Brussel sprouts are all for the best. Sometimes that is a hard sell to those around the dinner table.

This will be my first Christmas as a grandparent. I am still trying to sort our what I am supposed to be doing these days. But I hope that it is more about the peace, joy, and love part of Christmas than the prelude to Holy Week that often characterizes the Advent season. Church should not be a big scoop of spiritual lima beans. The commercial aspects of the season can certainly be put off until after Thanksgiving, but I am not one to wait any longer for Christmas carols, gingerbread, or thoughts of merry making. I am more than ready for Christmas to be here and I hope you all have a happy, healthy, and safe holiday season.


