One film that I have already preselected is "Casablanca." I chose it because I have never seen it. When I mentioned this omission to a few people, they were dumbfounded, so I figured I should remedy my impoverished cultural state.

Again, we will screen the movie during the week. Please let me know if Wednesday or Thursday nights would be better. We could also have a matinee showing some afternoon. We will discuss the film immediately afterwards, which conversations will be fair game for sermon fodder in case you were wondering. I will then preach about the film on the following Sunday.

ALTAR FLOWERS




