#### VERITAS, CARITAS, ET RISUS

Stories are at the core of what it means to be human. If you think about it, civilization itself is built around stories. For what is history but a story about who we have been. And what is culture but a story about who we think we are. Even religion can be described as a story: an extended story about who we hope to be. It is no coincidence that Jesus taught through parables, a form of story intended to convey a moral and ethic outlook to those who might listen.

This fall, we will begin the church year with a series of sermons about stories – movies specifically. Not every film rises to the level of a parable, but films can reflect what we consider to be important. They are stories we come back to again and again. Some people orient their holidays around viewing certain old favorites, such as *It's a Wonderful Life* or the *Ten Commandments*. Other movies harken back to various times in our lives, such as our childhood memories or the moments we have shared with children. Movies are entertainment, of course, but the great ones tell us a lot about the world around us and ourselves.

On Wednesday nights at 7pm, we will be screening films in the parish hall. You can alternatively queue up the movie from the comforts of home. The following Sunday, I will offer a sermon about the film and what it might mean in light of the scripture readings and the times we find ourselves in. We will start on 9/8 with *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*, a classic movie of absurdist humor. For the remainder of September, we will then enjoy *Casablanca*, the *Princess Bride*, and *Dr. Strangelove*. The series will continue through All Souls Sunday, including a special 10/6 service for the Blessing of the Animals with musings on the *Wizard of Oz* (because there is a dog, of course).


